

You are receiving this email because you have a non-research grant or cooperative agreement with one or more of the following CDC Centers, Institutes, or Offices (CIO):

- National Center on Birth Defects and Developmental Disabilities (NCBDDD)
- National Center for HIV/AIDS, Viral Hepatitis, STD, and TB Prevention (NCHHSTP)
- Office for State, Tribal, Local and Territorial Support (OSTLTS)
- Center for Surveillance, Epidemiology and Laboratory Services (CSELS)
- National Center for Injury Prevention and Control (NCIPC)
- National Center for Immunization and Respiratory Diseases (NCIRD)
- Office of Public Health Preparedness and Response (OPHPR)

CDC is transitioning to a new grants management system called GrantSolutions. You can see the first communication about this transition here if you missed it previously.

You will get access to the GrantSolutions Grants Management Module by February 2, 2017 and be able to access grant files for your grants if they come from one of the CIOs listed above. CDC is transitioning Non-Competing Continuation applications (NCC), Federal Financial Reports (FFR), and post-award amendment actions to the Grants Management Module in 2017. NCCs and FFRs are first and post-award amendment actions will happen later in 2017.

Accessing Your Grant

We will begin creating new accounts and providing access to existing account holders in late January. You should receive your account information or have your grant access no later than February 2 for the grants mentioned in the CIO list above.

You should fall into one of the following four situations:

- **1. If** your name is listed on the official Notice of Award but you have never used the GrantSolutions Grants Management Module (Authorizing Official and PI/PD); **then** you will receive two automated emails from the GrantSolutions Center of Excellence (COE) when your first grant becomes available. One will contain your log in and the other a temporary password.
- -You will automatically receive access to your other CDC/ATSDR non-research grants as the rollout happens. However, you will not be notified by the COE after the first one. The GrantSolutions Project Management Office will communicate with you as each new Center, Institute, or Office (CIO) opens access. You will get an email like this one when you receive access to grants from additional CIOs, if you have grants in more than one CIO.
- -You should watch the training videos.
- -You should contact the GrantSolutions Help Desk if you do not receive your account information by February 2. Include your grant number in your email to the Help Desk: help@grantsolutions.gov or 866-577-0771.
- **2.** If your name is listed on the official Notice of Award and you have an existing account in the GrantSolutions Grants Management Module; **then** you will not receive any official notification from the GrantSolutions COE.
- -Your grants will automatically appear in your My Grants section within the Grants Management Module as the rollout happens.
- -You do not have to take any action.
- -You should contact the GrantSolutions Help Desk if you do not receive access to your grants in GMM by February 2. Include your grant number in your email to the Help Desk: help@grantsolutions.gov or 866-577-0771.
- **3.** If your name is not listed on the official Notice of Award but you would like access and you have never used GrantSolutions; **then** you need to fill out a

new user access form and follow the directions in the document. You will receive two automated emails from the GrantSolutions Center of Excellence after your CDC grants management specialist approves the account.

- -This process primarily applies to people who want a Grantee Financial Official role or an additional PI/PD assigned to the grant.
- -You should watch the training videos.
- -You can send in your form on or after February 2.
- **4. If** your name is not listed on the official Notice of Award but you already have a Grants Management Module account, **then**, you need to send an email to GrantSolutions Help Desk with the grant number and the role you need to have. Here is a sample email: My name is << name>>. I work at << organization>>. I would like to be assigned to << grant number(s)>> as a << role>>. The Help Desk email is help@grantsolutions.gov
- -Your access will still follow the <u>integration schedule</u>. This process primarily applies to people who want a Grantee Financial Official role or an additional PI/PD assigned to the grant.
- -You can send this email on or after February 2.

You will receive additional emails like this one if you have grants or cooperative agreements from other Centers, Institutes, and Offices at CDC/ATSDR. These notifications will follow the agency's <u>integration schedule</u> for the Grants Management Module.

Non-Competing Continuations (NCC) and Federal Financial

Non-competing continuations

Your grants management specialist and project officers are working together to determine where your NCC application solicitations will be published and will communicate that to you. They are working diligently to move as many NCC solicitations as possible into the Grants Management Module. Check with your grants management specialist or project officer if you are unsure about your NCC application due date or submission channel.

Federal Financial Reports

If your final FFR is due <u>before</u> you have access to GMM; **then** submit it by email or hard copy to your grants management specialist.

If your final FFR is due <u>after</u> you have access to GMM; **then** submit it through GMM according to the GMM schedule which is 90 days after the end of the budget period. <u>Do not</u> submit it through eRA Commons nor by email.

If you have an interim FFR due as part of a NCC application; then submit the interim FFR as part of the NCC application.
